WAIT!

Don't "kit-nap" by moving the kittens just yet! A kitten's best chance of survival is with mom. LEAVE THE KITTENS WHERE THEY ARE. If you want to help, make sure mom has access to shelter, food, and water.

WATCH!

Keep a lookout for mom OR the nest.

Mom may be off hunting or not want to come around if people are present. Watch for her to come back in about 4 to 6 hours.

PRO TIP: Leave a ring of flour around the kittens. Check in 4 to 6 hours if you see mom's paw prints in the flour!

If the kittens are friendly,

utilize social media and your personal network to try and place them in loving homes.
