What is a microchip?



A microchip is a tiny device about the size of a grain of rice that sits beneath your pet's skin between their shoulder blades. It provides your pet with a permanent identification, so they have the best chance of returning home to you.

With a registered microchip...

A dog is 2.5x more likely to return home A cat is 20x more likely to return home

Remember, microchipping alone isn't enough!

- Make sure your pet's microchip is registered with the manufacturer
- Moved or changed your number?
 Update your registered contact info
- Make sure your pet is always wearing a collar with ID tags

FACTS

- Microchips use radio-frequency identification (RFID)
- Microchips only hold the ID number that is unique to them
- Microchips have no power source. They are inactive until a microchip reader is scanned over it
- Microchips are not a GPS and cannot track your pet
