Who Can Foster

• Over 18 years old • Must be available for appointments every 2-3 weeks or more Have time to spend with a foster animal



Preparing Your Home



- Separate your fosters from other animals in the household (minimum of 2 weeks)
- Good idea to use an area in your home that is easy to clean
- Foster animals are curious! Foster proof your home by:
 - Hiding all breakable objects, block electrical outlets, remove toxic plants or small items they might eat

Frequently Asked Questions

• How long do I need to foster?

- Each case varies
- Guardian Foster Program is short term
- What if I have to return my foster unexpectantly?
 - We understand life happens!
- How do I choose an animal to foster?
 - Foster staff will send out emails based on the animal types that are marked on the application. These emails will also contain information about each animal and what they need while in foster care
